### Message from the Council President

Our Article of Agreement with Jerusalem Lutheran Church in Rothsville to share a Pastor has been signed by the Bishop, and is in full effect. We are also hosting joint services, and events with our sister church.

Your Council has finished the work of the Ad Hoc Committee on Constitution and Bylaws, and has sent drafts to the Synod for their review. Following that, and any necessary final tweaking, the final draft of the Constitution and Bylaws will come before a future special Congregational Meeting (TBA) for a vote.

I know Easter is upon us and by the time you are reading this might have already passed, but I have a personal reflection to share, if you'll indulge me. ### From the Interim Pastor's Desk:

### He has risen! He is not here! Mark 16:6



He is risen! He is risen indeed. So goes our Easter greeting.

We are very familiar with this greeting. We have lived for years with this proclamation. The church has shared this proclamation for 2,000 years. Does it continue to have an impact on us? Or is it just something we say? Do we feel what the women felt that first Easter morning when they heard the young man in the garden proclaim this to them. According to Mark, "Trembling and bewildered, the women went out and fled from the tomb. They said nothing to anyone, because they were afraid."

The women went to the tomb because that is where they last saw Jesus, and that is where they expected him to be. What could be more natural? We, too, when we want to see Jesus, often go back to where we last saw him, to our last experience of Jesus. But what if we went back to that place, and a young man or woman told us "He has risen, he is not here." Would we be bewildered, would we flee from that place, would we be afraid?

In congregations that have declined in number, there is a natural desire to go back to that place where we last saw Jesus, to back to what used to be. And when we come to church and we don't find that thing that used to be, many leave wondering why, bewildered, and afraid of what is going to happen. But let's listen to more of the young person's message that Easter morning. They begin by saying, "Don't be alarmed," and they end by saying, "He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you."

This is my Easter message to you. Jesus has not just disappeared, but he has returned to "Galilee" that place where he worked miracles, healing and feeding people, where he taught and showed the way, where he raised people from the dead. Jesus has gone ahead and invites us to follow him into new ministries and new life; he is preparing the way. Can we hear the promise, "There you see him, just as he told you?" Easter is a time when we renew our faith in the risen Jesus who has invited us to be part of God's mission to the world of unbelief, a world with so many needs. The Easter season is a time that we as Christians renew our faith in thanksgiving for baptism. Easter is a time when we recommit ourselves to worship, to fellowship and to service. Easter is a time when we celebrate not the old life, but the new life in Christ, like spring time following winter.

### Special announcement:.

In April and May, all committees are asked to set a meeting with their counterpart at our partner church (Jerusalem/Brickerville). The vision for the shared ministry certainly focuses on sharing the cost of a pastor. However, though it is not understood as a merger, the vision also opens the door to imagining other ways to share resources for effective ministry. Perhaps foremost, these joint meetings will serve as an opportunity to get to know each other better at both a personal and functional level. Specifically, we are aiming at four areas of conversation: 1. Worship and Music, 2. Mission and Service, 3. Fellowship, and 4. Finance and Property. To prepare for these joint meetings, each of these four groups will hold a 15 to 20 minute "hearing" with members of their own congregation prior to their joint meeting. These "hearings" will be held after church: at Brickerville during the fellowship time before Sunday School; at Jerusalem, after worship remaining in the sanctuary. The first hearing, Worship and Music, will be held on April 14, and the other three on the three consecutive Sundays. During these "hearings" the committees will try to hear hopes and concerns of the community concerning their area of ministry. What have you liked about the shared ministry so far? What would you like to see going forward? What questions do you have about the other congregation?





## The Basics of Death Certificates Explained:



Most people don't give much thought to death certificates until they have a death in the family. A death certificate is the permanent legal recorded needed to prove that a person has actually died. A copy of the death certificate is necessary to execute a will, file legal paperwork, deal with real estate transactions and submit insurance claims. Historically, deaths, baptisms and marriages were recorded by local churches. The civil registration of births, marriages, and deaths by secular courts has a long history in the United States, beginning with a law enacted by Virginia in 1632. The concept of these laws was the protection of individual rights, particularly relating to ownership and distribution of property, rather than for statistical uses.

In 1902, when the U.S. Bureau of the Census was made a permanent agency of the federal government, the legislation authorized the director of the Bureau to obtain, annually, copies of records filed in the vital statistics offices of those states and cities that have death registration systems. A standard death certificate format was developed around 1910 and by 1915, the national registration was established. In 1933, all states were required to record births and deaths and provide data to the federal Census Bureau.

In Pennsylvania, a physician (or other qualified medical professional) must sign a death certificate within 96 hours of the death occurring. The death certificate provides important information about the decedent, such as age, sex, race, date of death, his or her parents, and, if married, the name of the spouse; information on circumstances and cause of death; and final disposition. The filing of the death certificate is the responsibility of the funeral director. The registrar signs the last section of the death certificate and submits it to the PA Vital Records.

Buch Funeral Home will submit an electronic death certificate, which will notify Social Security. In addition, if the person qualifies for Veteran's death benefits, Buch will notify the Veteran's Administration of the death. You will need to provide certified copies of the death certificate, which the funeral home will supply to you, when you are managing a pension, claiming life insurance, closing accounts and transferring ownership of any vehicles, real estate, or other property. The checklist below will help you determine how many copies of the death certificate you may need.

If you find that you need additional copies of the death certificate, you can contact Buch Funeral Home to obtain additional copies within 90 days of the date of death. Copies requested after 90 days must be processed by Vital Records in New Castle, PA. You can also order copies of the death certificate online at <a href="https://www.health.pa.gov">https://www.health.pa.gov</a> or <a href="https://www.health.pa.gov">https://www.health.pa.gov</a>.

All fees for death certificates are established by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and paid directly to them. Currently, the standard death certificate fee is \$20, along with a processing fee. This fee may be waived for records of individuals who served in the Armed Forces and their dependents.

In Pennsylvania, applicants must be 18 years of age or older to request a death certificate and include the following: a spouse or ex-spouse, parent or step-parent, child or step-child, sibling or half-sibling, grandparent or great-grandparent, grandchild or great-grandchild, or legal representative. To request a certificate, you'll need to have proof that you're related to the deceased. You may also be required to provide additional information, like their last known address, race, birthplace, or marital status.

To request the certificate, you'll likely need the following information about the deceased:

Full legal name
Sex
Social Security Number
Date of birth
Date of death
Place of death
Father's legal name
Mother's maiden name


